The Municipality hosted a Women's Day Celebration to celebrate women and the role that they continue to play in modern day society. The employees were treated to a formal event which saw Da Mandi Hall in Grootvlei being transformed to a miniature castle fit for royalty under the theme 'Queens don't quit'.

The event was hosted during a time when the country is facing massive uproar against the escalating and distressing trend of gender based violence, loosely termed 'femicide' in the country.

Prolific views of women empowerment and development were hammered by the speakers as they echoed statements against gender based violence and abuse. Advancing how women tend to mistakenly allow and nurture these destructive acts for a variety of reasons as opposed to sounding the alarm or permanently removing themselves from those potentially life threatening environments.

The ladies described the 'all black with a touch of gold' event as an epic experience of note that they will cherish for years to come, with the speeches rendered having more to do with that than anything else as they were encouraged to continue to be the embodiment of hope for themselves, their children and families and the entire society at large.

Ms Tshepiso Masenya who is a Board Member for the Mpumalanga Economic Growth Agency (MEGA), was a magnificent and captivating speaker at the event. She broadened the queen's horizons as she explored the topic of 'women in leadership'.

The Acting Municipal Manager, Mrs. Conny Mametja was an ideal speaker of the day as she has dedicated a fair amount of her professional life to issues that affect women in general, *queens* as they are called.

'History teaches us that women are agents of change, makers of peace and drivers of progress and I have personally met countless women who are doing just that', she said and she went on to remind the 'queens' that it is not yet uhuru as they still have a long road ahead of them in the fight for their economic emancipation and empowerment.

She paid homage to the over 20000 brave women of 1956 led by Lillian Ngoyi, Albertina Sisulu and other queens that shown the stereotyping of women as politically inept and immature, tied to and only the home was outdated and inaccurate which ties in nicely with the contemporary accepted slogan that says "Wathinta abafazi, watinta'imbokodo".

She also indicated that women suffer from what is called a PHD syndrome (pull her down syndrome), a disease can be cured by conversations like these where women come together and share valuable experiences, appreciate and learn from each other instead of pulling each other down.

A special honour of long service was given to Mrs. Lynnette Noeth, in recognition of her thirty one years of dedicated and diligent service to the municipality as she will regrettably be leaving the institution.
